Bothered by Telemarketing Calls?

You can reduce the number of unwanted calls you receive by signing up with the National and Indiana Do-Not-Call registries for FREE. Most legitimate companies will not call you once you have been on the registry for 31 days. If a company is ignoring the registry, there's a good chance it's a scam. If this occurs, hang up and file a complaint with the FTC and Indiana's Telephone Privacy Division of the Attorney General's Office.

Note: If you have another email address you use, let us know, and we can forward all emails that go to your @seidata.com address to the one you regularly use so you won't miss out on important information.

Identity thieves may try to get your personal identification information any number of ways. They might go through the trash, steal credit/debit card numbers when you use them, take your wallet or purse, or use deceptive methods online such as sending you a fake email asking you to update your bank records or verify some kind of account information. If they get your information, they can cause significant financial problems that can take hours and hours to resolve.

REMEMBER - SEI will NEVER ask for personal information through email!!

Things to consider while you are online:

- 1. Change your password on a regular basis.
- 2. Do not use obvious passwords like your mother's maiden name or your birth date. A strong password will include more than 7 characters, a combination of upper and lower case letters, and a mixture of numbers, letters, and special characters.
- 3. Avoid using a public computer or a wireless "hot spot" for financial transactions, as others may be able to intercept your information.
- 4. Do not click on unknown links in unsolicited emails, even if it is from a company you know is legitimate. Instead, type the web address in your browser and then login to your account.
- 5. Always be wary of any email that asks for personal information of any kind: name, family names, date of birth, social security number, address, etc.
- 6. Try to use only one credit card for online purchases. That way, if something happens, it will be easier to spot on your bill and easier to freeze or cancel that card.
- 7. Use anti-virus software, and make sure your computer is set to automatically download the latest virus patches and fixes.
